WEST BERKSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL PROPOSES to make an Order under Section 32, 35 and 38 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") the effect of which is to implement a new Bus Station at Newbury Wharf as follows

Newbury Wharf Bus Station Newbury

To regulate the new Bus Station on Newbury Wharf and to put in place a means for Civil Enforcement Officer to raise Penalty Charge Notices where Local, National Buses and Coaches overstay their allotted times for dropping off and picking up and laying over.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

West Berkshire District Council has contracted to build a new Bus Station at Newbury Wharf to facilitate local and national coaches. The old Bus Station at Market Street is due to be closed on the completion of the new Bus Station and will be used for a short period as an additional car park but will eventually be demolished when the Market Street Regeneration programme begins.

WEST BERKSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL in exercise of their powers under Section 32, 35 and 38 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Parts I and III of Schedule 9 of the 1984 Act hereby makes the following Order

1. This Order shall come into operation on the [] day of [] 201[] and may be cited as the **WEST BERKSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL (NEWBURY WHARF BUS STATION, NEWBURY) ORDER 201[]**

2. In this Order:-

Any reference to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment. Where the context otherwise requires the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them

"Bus" has the same meaning as Schedule 1 of the General Directions;

"Bus and Coach Operators" means those bodies who operate buses and coaches for the conveyance of passengers;

"Charging Days" means the period as specified in Schedule 2 attached to this Order;

"Charging Hours" mean the time periods as specified in Schedule 2 attached to this Order;

"Civil Enforcement Officer" has the same meaning as in section 76 of the 2004 Act;

"Coach/Coach Service" means a coach service using one or more Public Service Vehicles to carry passengers by road at separate fares and in determining whether any service is a coach service regard shall be paid to all the circumstances including:

- (a) the distance between the departure point and the final destination of the service measured in a straight line and in particular whether that distance is thirty miles or greater;
- (b) whether each Public Service Vehicle used in the provision of this service is licenced to carry standing passengers for any length of that service;
- (c) the number, frequency or infrequency of stopping points between the departure point and the final destination of the service;
- (d) whether passengers can reserve seats on the service in advance of their journey; and
- (e) whether or not each Public Service Vehicle used in the provision of the service:
 - (i) is required by any enactment to be fitted with seatbelts;
 - (ii) is limited by any enactment to travelling at a speed of no more than sixty-two miles per hour;
 - (iii) has separate below deck luggage compartment; and
 - (iv) is fitted with toilet or restroom facilities;

And PROVIDED THAT where any service is a combination of a Local Bus Service and a Coach Service, that service shall be treated as a Coach Service for the purposes of this Order;

"Council" means West Berkshire District Council;

"Cycle" has the same meaning as in section 192 of the Road Traffic Act 1988;

"Daily Charge" means the charge imposed by the Council for parking in a Parking Place on any day and for a specified period of time as is identified in the Scale of Charges set out in the Schedule 2 to this Order and also on the relevant Notices shown on the Notice Boards erected at the Parking Place;

"Disabled Person's Badge" means a badge issued by any Local Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) Regulations 2000 or a badge having effect under those Regulations as if it were a Disabled Person's Badge;

"Driver" in relation to the vehicle waiting on contravention of an Order, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left at that contravention or the person deemed to be the driver;

“Enforcement Authority” means the Council, the Bus Station Manager or the Council's Enforcement Officer;

“Expiry Time” is when the parking time purchased through the pay by phone service expires and is the time when additional parking time must be purchased (if applicable) or when the vehicle must leave the Parking Place;

“Free Parking Period” means a period of no more than twenty minutes allowed to buses initially parking in the Bus Stands

“General Directions” shall mean The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016;

“General Regulations 2007” shall mean the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007;

“Heavy Commercial Vehicle” has the same meaning as in Section 138 of the 1984 Act;

“Library Buses” means any commercial vehicle used by West Berkshire Council's Library Services;

“Local Service” has the same meaning as in Section 2 of the Transport Act 1985;

“Motor Car”; “Motor Cycle” and “Invalid Carriage” have the same meaning as in Section 136 of the 1984 Act;

“National Bus Service” means a service operated as part of a quality contracts scheme or ticketing scheme under Section 162 of the Transport Act 2000;

“No Return Period” means a period of no less than thirty minutes during which time a vehicle may not return to the Parking Place;

“Operator's Agreement” means the Agreement that must be concluded between the Council and the bus and coach operators prior to using the Newbury Wharf Bus Station;

“Parking Place” in this Order means the Newbury Wharf Bus Station situated at Newbury Wharf off Bear Lane Newbury and provided by the Council for use as a bus station and coach park;

“Payment by Phone” means payment of the stipulated parking charge to the Council's appointed service provided either by means of a telephone or through an on-line payment;

“Penalty Charge” has the same meaning as in Regulation 2 of the General Regulations 2007;

“Penalty Charge Notice” has the same meaning as in Regulation 8 of the General Regulations 2007;

“Parking Bay” means

- (i) an area of the parking place indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place as an area where a vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, may be stationed; or
- (ii) an area of the parking place adjacent to a designed lettered shelter (stand) and operating safety gate where passengers may board and alight the vehicle;

“Ticket Machine” means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the appropriate Minister for the purposes of the 1984 Act being apparatus:

- (i) designed to indicate the time by a clock and to issue parking tickets indicating the time by a clock and to issue pay and display tickets indicating the payment of a charge the day and time at which the charge was paid and the expiry time of the parking period for which the payment has been made;
- (ii) designed to issue a ticket showing the date and time of entry into the Parking Place and which ticket is subsequently validated upon payment of the appropriate charge at the Parking Place prior to departure;

**PART I
PARKING PROVISIONS**

- 3(1) The Off Street Parking Place specified in the Schedule to this Order is hereby appointed as a coach and bus station pursuant to Section 38 of the 1984 Act
- 3(2) The Parking Place may be used subject to the provisions of this Order at all times as an off-street parking place for those buses operating a local service, a national bus service or a coach service, Library Buses and authorised in writing to wait in the parking bays specified in Schedule 1 to this Order;
4. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any other motor vehicle to enter, proceed or wait in the Parking Place at any time
5. Nothing in Article 4 shall prevent a person to cause or permit a vehicle to enter or wait in the Parking Place provided that vehicle is:
 - (i) a vehicle appearing to the Civil Enforcement Officer or Police Constable in uniform to be present in the Parking Place for the purposes of maintaining or servicing a vehicle authorised to use the Parking Place in accordance with Article 3(2) of this Order;
 - (ii) a vehicle that has received prior expressed authorisation from the Council making deliveries, loading or unloading, or providing services within the Parking Place for such period as the Civil Enforcement Officer or Enforcement Authority shall determine;
 - (iii) being used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
 - (iv) a vehicle accessing or leaving the Parking Place to the Newbury Library to collect Waste but such vehicle shall not wait within the Parking Place specified within this Order;
 - (v) an unriden cycle being pushed through the pedestrian area of the Parking Place
6. No vehicle shall be allowed to use the facilities at the Newbury Wharf Bus Station unless it has been included within the Operator's Agreement concluded between the Council and the Bus and Coach Operator operating the vehicle;
7. Where in the Parking Place a Parking Bay is designed by surface or other markings, as available for vehicles of a specified class the driver/rider of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the Parking Place or Parking Bay unless it is that specified class
8. No vehicle shall be left in the Parking Place other than wholly within a Parking Bay and in particular no vehicle shall be left or allowed to stand in the Parking Place in such a position as to obstruct the entrance thereto or the exit therefrom nor in such a position as to prevent the driving away of any vehicle already standing in the Parking Place or in such a position as to cause an obstruction to other vehicles
9. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Council by notice sign or barrier displayed or erected in a Parking Place:
 - (i) from closing a Parking Place or any part thereof for any period; and/or
 - (ii) from setting aside a Parking Place or any part or parts thereof on all days or on certain days or during certain parts of the day for use by particular vehicles or organisations
10. No person shall in a Parking Place drain or discharge fuel from the fuel tank of a vehicle for the purpose of cleaning the tank or to transfer fuel from one vehicle to another
11. No person shall in a Parking Place discharge any liquid from a vehicle or otherwise drop litter in the Parking Place

12. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in a Parking Place marked for disabled persons unless the vehicle displays in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge and immediately before or immediately after the act of parking the vehicle has been or is about to be used by the person(s) in respect of whom the disabled person's badge has been issued
13. No person in a Parking Place shall undertake any activity of servicing repair or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable the vehicle to depart from the Parking Place
14. Where specified in the Schedule or by notice on site a Parking Place is described as having a period within which a vehicle may not return no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked again in that Parking Place on any day during such hours within which the vehicle is excluded from waiting in the Parking Place
15. Where specified in the Schedule and by notice on site a Parking Place or in any parking bay within the Parking Place is described as being in operation on specified days during specified hours or for a maximum period of stay no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in that Parking Place or in any parking bay within the Parking Place on any day during such hours or for any period other or longer than those specified

PART II

CHARGES FOR PARKING

16. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be parked during the charging hours in a Parking Place without arranging for the appropriate charge (if any) to be paid in accordance with the scale of current charges as specified within the Schedule or by notice on site
17. Where a charge is specified for a period the whole of that charge shall be due and payable for the use of the Parking Place for any part of that period
18. The charges referred to in the preceding Article shall be payable in the manner as advertised at that Parking Place
19. The expiry of the period for which the appropriate charge has been paid shall be when the period of parking time purchased with the Council's appointed pay by mobile phone service provider has expired
20. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be parked during the charging hours in a pay to park Parking Place after the expiry of the purchased parking time
21. If at any time while the vehicle is parked in a Parking Place it shall be deemed that the charge has not been paid unless the Council has been notified by its appointed pay by mobile phone service provider that a charge has been paid
22. From Monday to Saturday between the hours of 4.00 am to 6.00 pm all buses using the bus stands will have a free parking period of twenty minutes. At the expiry of this free parking period the vehicle must leave the parking place and no return to the parking place will be allowed for a minimum period of thirty minutes. If a parking charge is paid after the free parking period has elapsed the vehicle may remain in the parking place until the paid parking time has expired.
23. From Monday to Saturday between the hours of 6.00 pm until 4.00 am and at all hours on Sundays coaches will be permitted to use the bus stands and shall pay the appropriate parking charge displayed on the tariff boards.
24. The times shown in 22 and 23 above may be varied by the Council at its absolute discretion and where such variation occurs the revised days and or times will be prominently displayed on notices in the Parking Place by the Council who shall give at least two weeks prior notice before the changes of days and or times shall take effect.
25. No exemption of the parking charges is made for persons who hold a Disabled Person's badge

PART III
PENALTY CHARGE AND PENALTY CHARGE NOTICE

- 26(1) Where a driver has left a vehicle in the Parking Place in contravention of this Order a Penalty Charge shall become payable. A Penalty Charge Notice to that effect will be attached to the vehicle or handed to the driver by a Civil Enforcement Officer, in accordance with Article 26(4) of this Order
- 26(2) A Penalty Charge shall be payable to the Enforcement Authority
- 26(3) In the event of payment of the Penalty Charge being received by the Enforcement Authority within fourteen (14) days of the day in which it was incurred the amount of Penalty Charge will be discounted in accordance with Regulation 5 of the General Regulations 2007
- 26(4) A Penalty Charge Notice referred to in Article 26(1) and issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer shall include the following particulars:
- (a) the Enforcement Authority
 - (b) the Parking Place at which the contravention occurred (which may be identified on the Penalty Charge Notice by an abbreviation or code)
 - (c) the registration mark of the vehicle or when the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the registration mark of that trade licence
 - (d) The date and time at which the alleged contravention occurred
 - (e) the grounds on which the Civil Enforcement Officer serving the Notice believes that a Penalty Charge is payable
 - (f) the amount of the Penalty Charge
 - (g) the manner in which the Penalty Charge must be paid
 - (h) a statement that a reduced charge may be payable if payment is made within Fourteen (14) days of the Penalty Charge Notice being incurred. The reduced charge is currently Fifty (50%) per cent
 - (i) a statement to the effect that if the Penalty Charge is not paid before the end of the period Twenty-eight (28) days a notice to the Owner (NtO) may be served by the Enforcement Authority on the Owner of the vehicle
 - (j) A statement to the effect that a person on whom an NtO is served will be entitled to make representations to the enforcement authority against the penalty charge and may appeal to an adjudicator if those representations are rejected
 - (k) Those representations will be considered
 - (l) If an NtO is served notwithstanding those representations, representations against the penalty charge must be in the form and manner and at the time specified in the NtO
- 27(1) Where a driver has left a vehicle in a Parking Place in contravention of this Order and a Penalty Charge Notice could not be issued as specified in Article 26(1) of this Order a Penalty Charge Notice may be issued by post by the Enforcement Authority in accordance with Section 10 of the General Regulations 2007
- 27(2) Any Penalty Charge Notice issued in accordance with Article 26(1) of this Order shall, in addition to the particulars specified in Article 26(4)(a) (b) (c) (e) and (f) of this Order include the particulars specified in paragraph 2 of the Schedule to the General Regulations 2007
- 28(1) The Penalty Charge referred to in Article 26(1) shall be paid to the Enforcement Authority in accordance with the instructions on the reverse of the Penalty Charge Notice

- 28(2) The driver of a vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge has been incurred shall pay the Penalty Charge or provide proof of payment of the Penalty Charge to the Enforcement Authority as detailed on the reverse of the Notice within twenty-eight (28) days of the date on which the notice is served. If payment is received within a period of Fourteen (14) days beginning with the date on which the notice is served the amount of the said charge shall be reduced by fifty per cent (50%) (provided that if the fourteen (14) days falls upon a day on which the Enforcement Authority's offices are closed the period within which payment of the said charge is due shall be extended to 17:00 hours (5.00 p.m.) on the next full day on which the office is open)
- 28(3) Where a driver of a vehicle fails to pay the Penalty Charge as specified in Articles 28(1) and 28(2) of this Order the Enforcement Authority may follow the procedures set out in the General Regulations 2007 to recover the Penalty Charge
- 28(4) A driver who desires to make representations to or appeal against a Penalty Charge Notice issued to him/her may make representations or appeal to the Enforcement Authority pursuant to the procedures set out in the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) Representations and Appeals Regulations 2007
29. Save for the provisions of Article 35 a vehicle is parked in a Parking Place without complying with the requirements of this Order a contravention shall have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable
30. Any notice fixed to a vehicle in contravention of any provision of this Order shall not be removed or interfered with except by or under the authority of
- (i) the owner of person in charge of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the Council for the Parking Place in which the vehicle in question was found
- 31 The particulars given in any notice served on a vehicle in contravention of any provision of this Order shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay the penalty charge

**PART IV
USE OF PARKING PLACES**

32. The driver of a vehicle using the Parking Place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in a designed Parking Bay and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in the Parking Bay or to depart from the Parking Place
33. Except with the authority of the Council or person authorised on behalf of the Council, no person shall use a vehicle whilst it is in the Parking Place in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the Parking Place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services other than to enable the operation of a Local Service or National Bus Service
34. Except with the authority of the Council or person authorised on behalf of the Council, no person shall distribute any advertising material or affix or cause to be affixed any advertising material to any vehicle left in the Parking Place
35. Subject to the proviso, when a vehicle is left in the Parking Place in contravention of any of the provisions of Articles 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of this Order, or it is necessary to meet the requirements of an emergency a person authorised on behalf of the Council or a Civil Enforcement Officer may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from the Parking Place or may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions
36. Any person removing or altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of Article 35 of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as that person may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as that person may think necessary to enable that person to remove or alter its position
37. When a person authorised by the Council or a Civil Enforcement Officer removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from the Parking Place by virtue of Articles 35 and 36 of this Order that person shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle
38. Where a vehicle has been removed in accordance with Articles 34, 35 and 36 of this Order the charges as specified in Section 3 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Guidelines on Levels of Charges) (England) Order 2007 shall become payable
39. Neither such person nor the Council shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the vehicle or to anything contained therein or attached thereto arising from or in consequence of the exercise of the powers in Articles 35, 36, 37 and 38
40. The driver of a motor vehicle using the Parking Place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the Parking Place
41. No person shall in the Parking Place wantonly shout or otherwise make a loud noise to the disturbance or annoyance of users of the Parking Place or business premises in the neighbourhood
42. No person shall in the Parking Place use any threatening abusive or insulting language gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear or so occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned
43. No person shall except with the written authority of the Council or Enforcement Authority use any part of the Parking Place or any vehicle in the Parking Place:
 - (a) for sleeping or camping purposes;
 - (b) for eating or cooking purposes;
 - (c) for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the Parking Place;

44. No person shall at any time use any part of the Parking Place or any vehicle in the Parking Place
- (a) for skateboarding, roller skating or wheeled activities which may be hazardous to pedestrians;
 - (b) for the instruction of pupils whilst undertaking driving lessons
45. No person shall play or take part in any game in the Parking Place
46. No person shall use the Parking Place as a means of passing or proceeding from one road to another road
47. Where the Parking Place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:
- (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the Parking Place; or
 - (b) indicating that a vehicle using the Parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the Parking Place
- no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle so that it
- (i) enters the Parking Place otherwise than by an entrance or leave the Parking Place otherwise than by an exit so indicated or
 - (ii) proceed in a direction other than that specified
- as the case may be
48. In the Parking Place no person shall except with the authority of the Council or person authorised on behalf of the Council:
- (a) erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent booth stand building or other structure;
 - (b) light or cause or permit to be lit any fire
49. No person shall enter the Parking Place whilst towing any vehicle except:
- (i) where the towed vehicle is required in order that a vehicle may be removed in accordance with Article 15 of this Order
 - (ii) where the towed vehicle is carrying equipment required by the driver for maintenance at the Parking Place
 - (iii) where the towed vehicle is required for remedial works at or to the Parking Place by Statutory Utilities Staff
 - (iv) where permission has been granted by the Council or a Police Constable in uniform
50. When a Penalty Charge Notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 6 no person not being the driver of the vehicle or a person duly authorised by the Council shall remove the Penalty Charge Notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver
51. By conspicuous notices to the effect the Council may suspend Parking on the Parking Place or part thereof and failure to observe such notices shall be a contravention of this Order
52. In the Parking Place no person shall leave a vehicle stationed overnight except buses and coaches or upon the direction or with the permission of the Council or a Civil Enforcement Officer

53. (a) The Council accepts no liability for the loss or damage to vehicles or other property in any of the Parking Places to which this Order applies save for that arising from the negligence of the Council
- (b) If a court the Department for Transport the Traffic Penalty Tribunal or the Traffic Enforcement Centre declares any part of this Order to be invalid or unenforceable such declaration shall not invalidate the remainder of the Order

**PART VI
REVOCATIONS**

54. The following Order will become revoked on the date of commencement of this Order as follows:-

The West Berkshire District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) (Civil Enforcement and Consolidation) Order 2009 insofar as it relates to Schedule 1 Pay and Display Car Parks Outer Long Stay Car Parks and Coach Park
55. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision of any previous Order that provision of this Order shall prevail
