



For VE-Day, red, white and blue bunting was available and was hung in the streets. To mark 75 years since VE-Day, people will be decorating bunting and hanging it in their windows.

Using this template or on pieces of paper decorate some bunting and hang it in your window for passers-by to see.

Your bunting doesn't need to be red, white and blue but could be inspired by other flags, a poppy to commemorate the fallen, a dove to celebrate lasting peace or a rainbow to symbolise hope.

Here's how to make your own bunting:

1. Print the supplied template for your bunting. We have several options to choose from: colour your own version or why not get creative and design your own.
2. Cut out the template.
3. Cut or punch a hole in the small markers at the base of the triangle.
4. Using string or ribbon, thread through the holes on either side.
5. Tie a small knot on either end to prevent the flags from bunching up.
6. Repeat, adding as many flags as you wish to get the desired length.
7. Hang up your bunting.
